

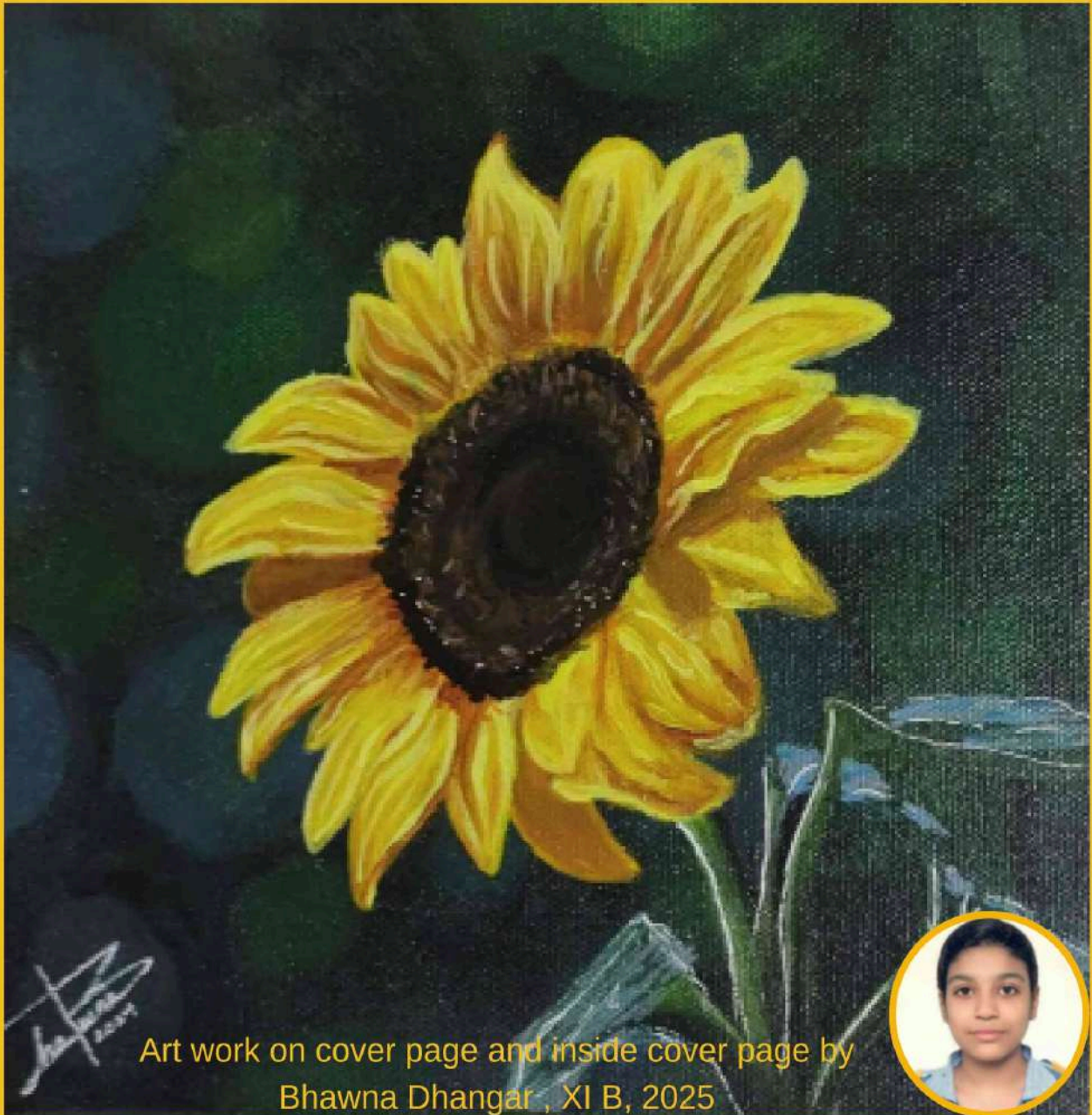

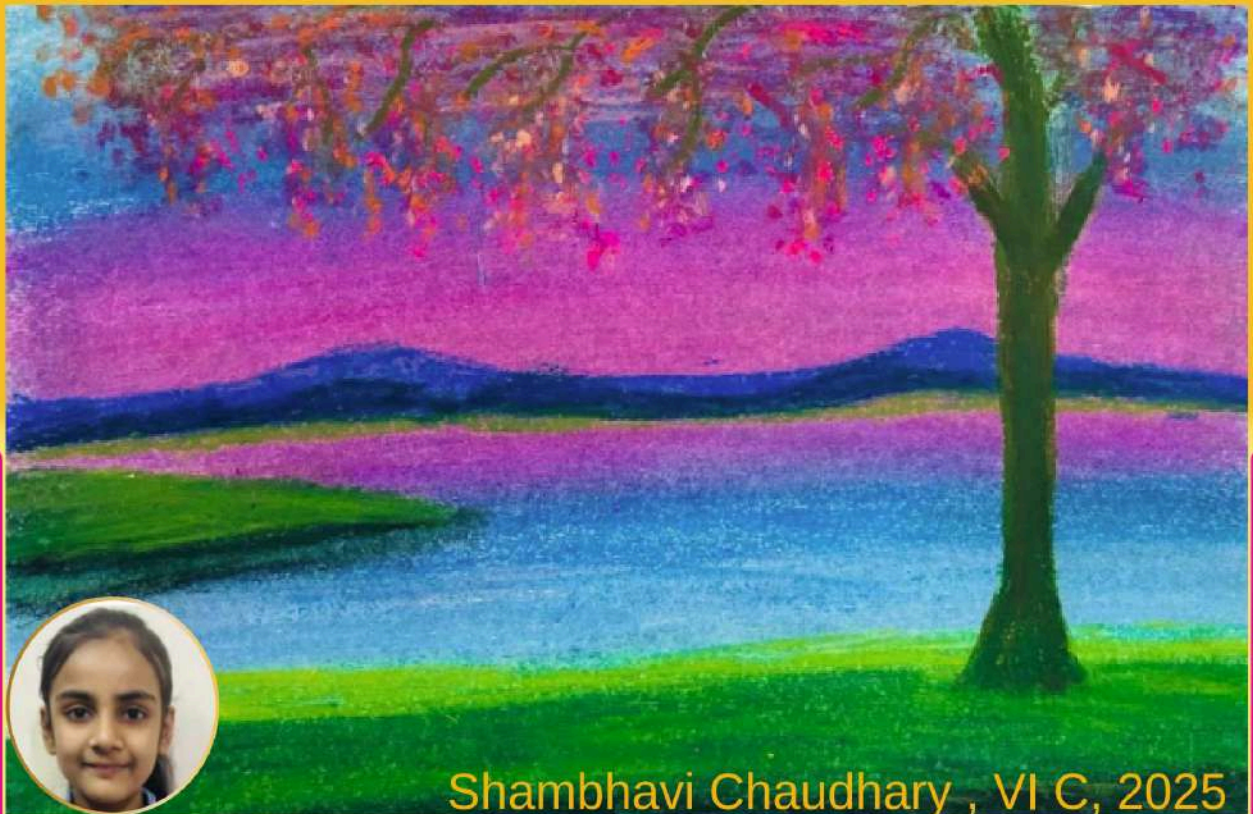

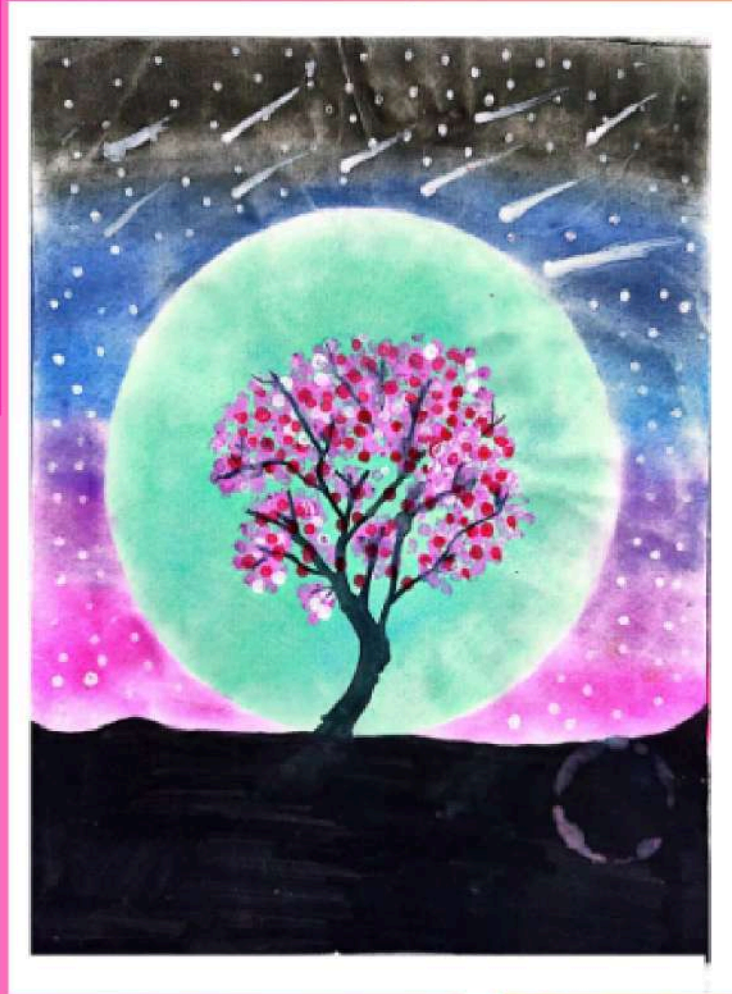
Our commitment to sustainability also took a significant step forward with the installation of solar panels—a step that not only supports a greener future but also serves as a meaningful learning experience for our students.

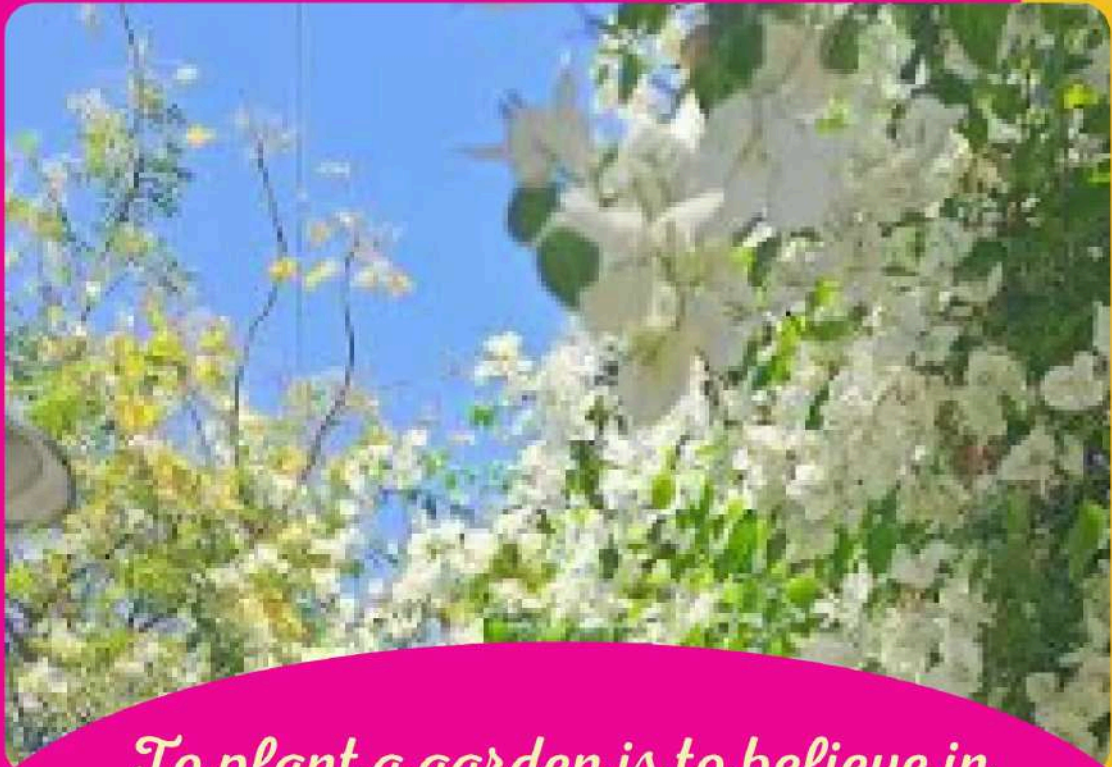
Annual Day

Ahlcon Junior Football Premier League 1.0

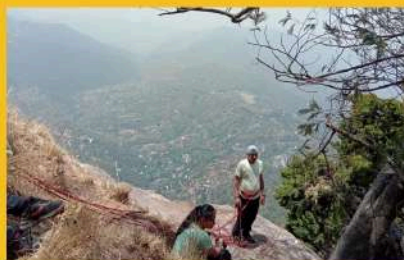
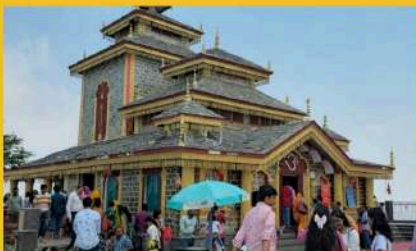

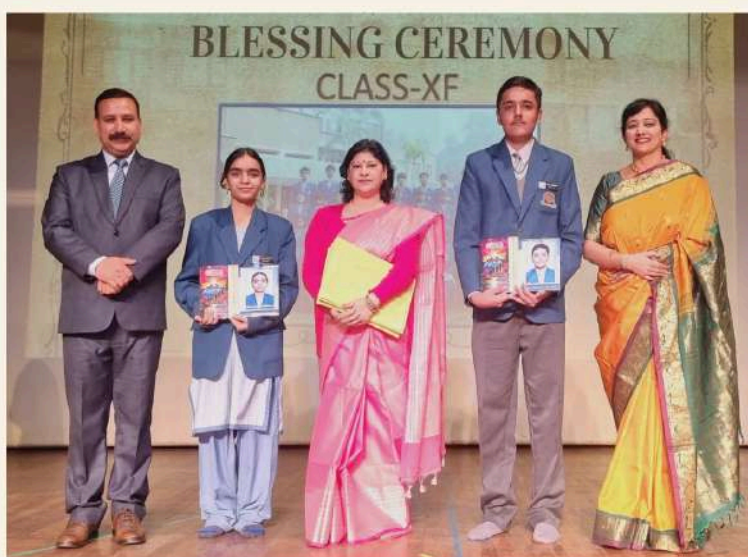

Une Petite Histoire d'Auto-évaluation

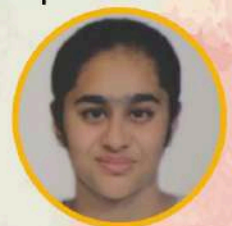

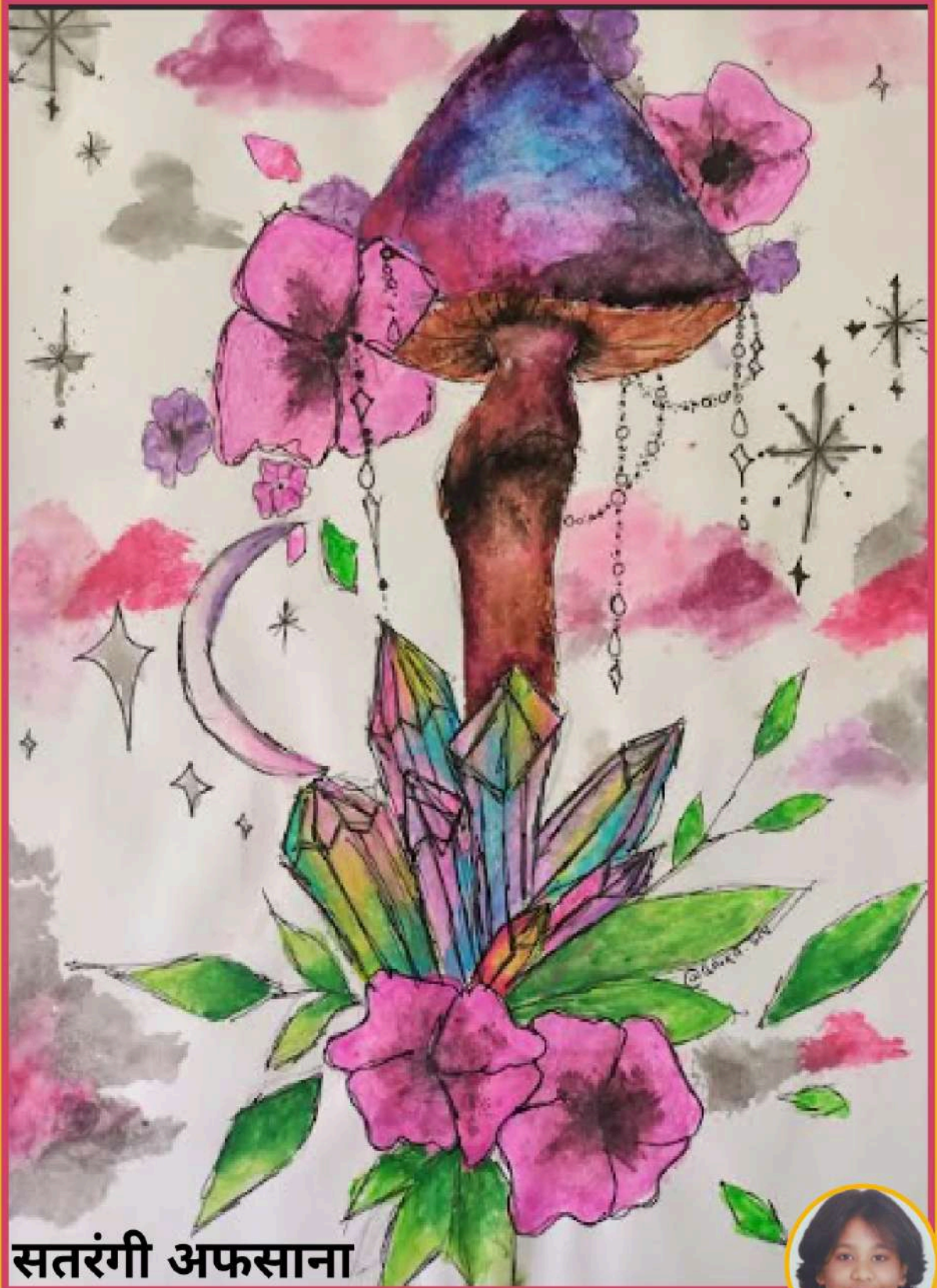

तभी मिलेगा अच्छा परिणाम।

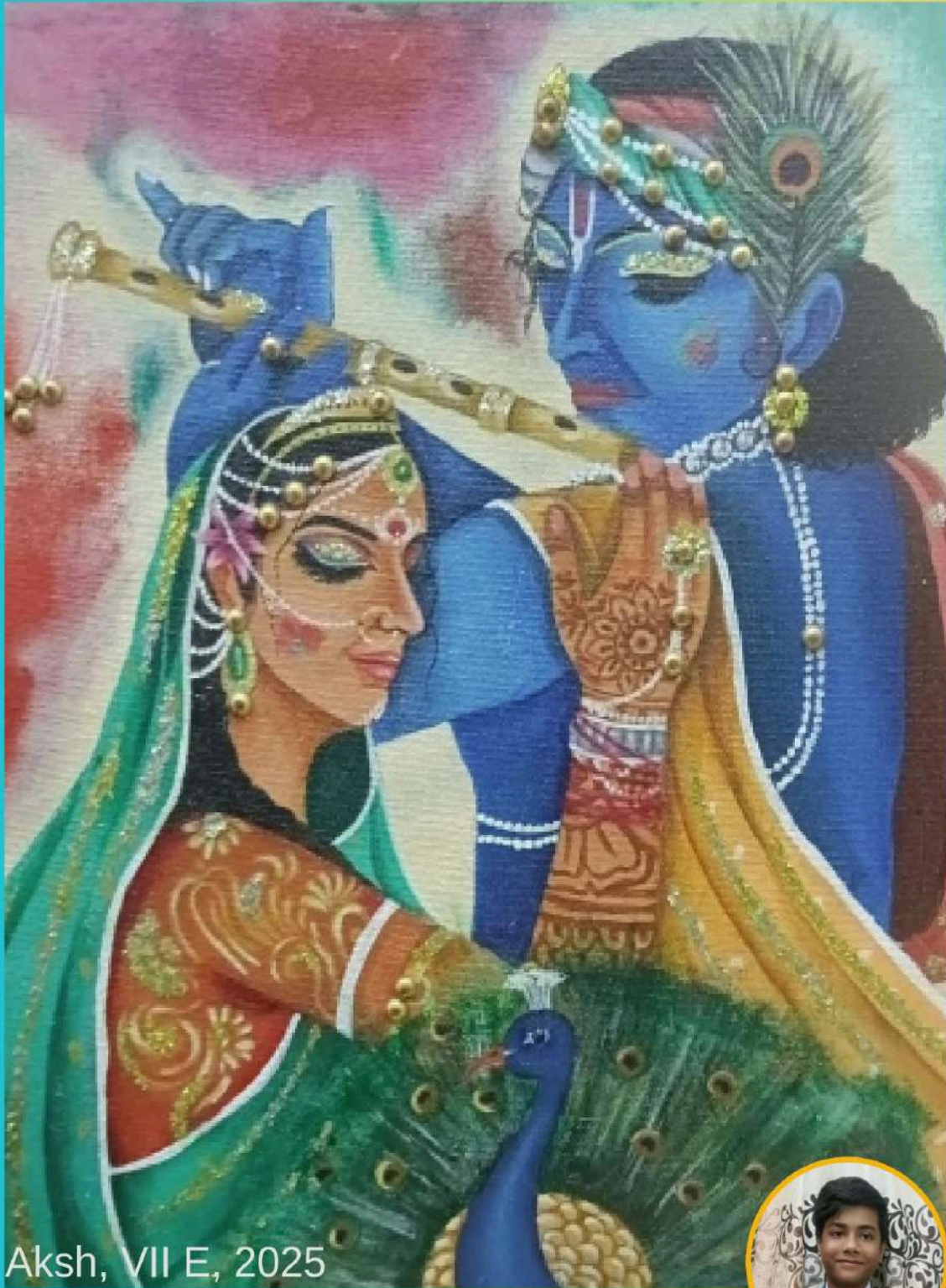

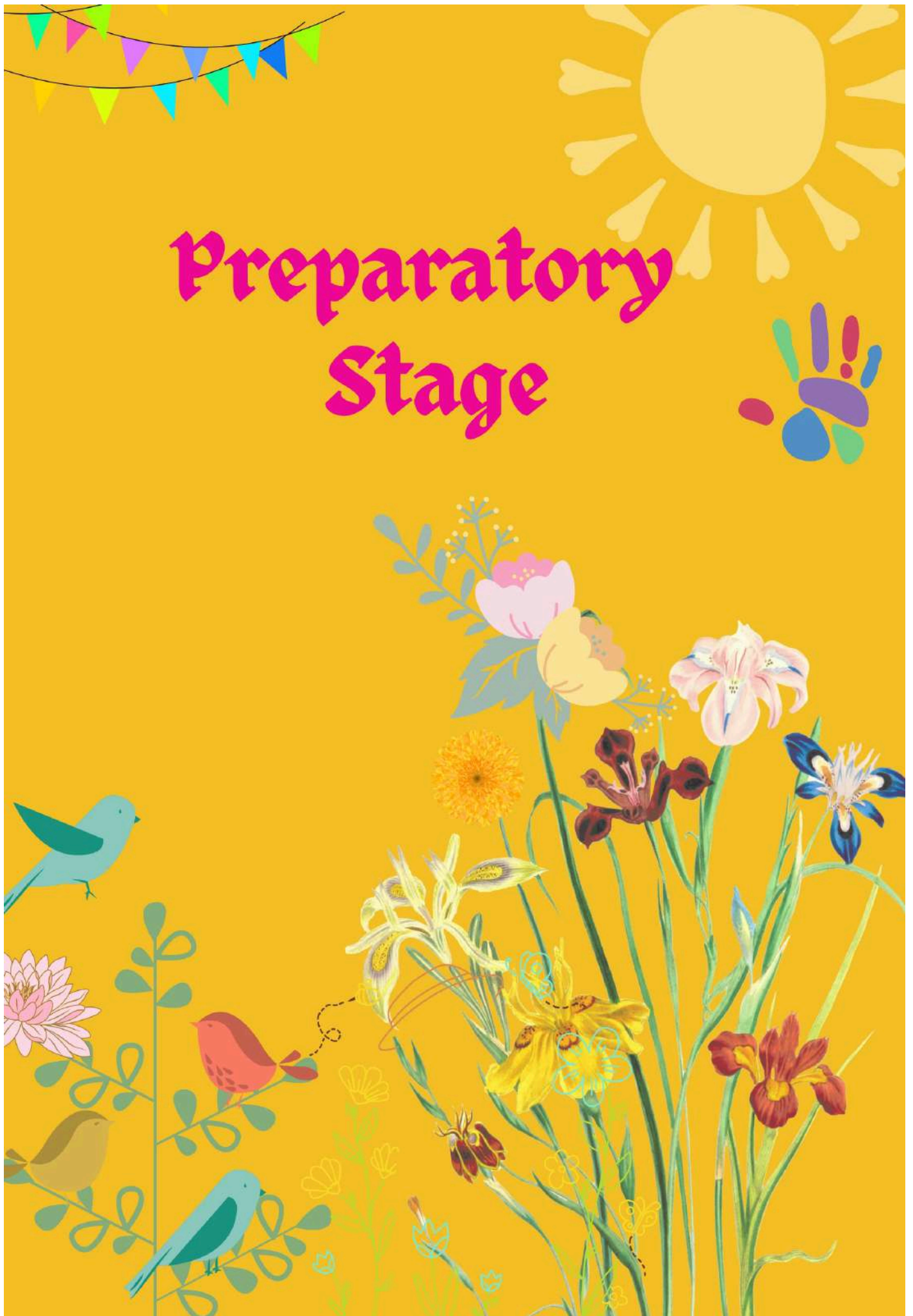

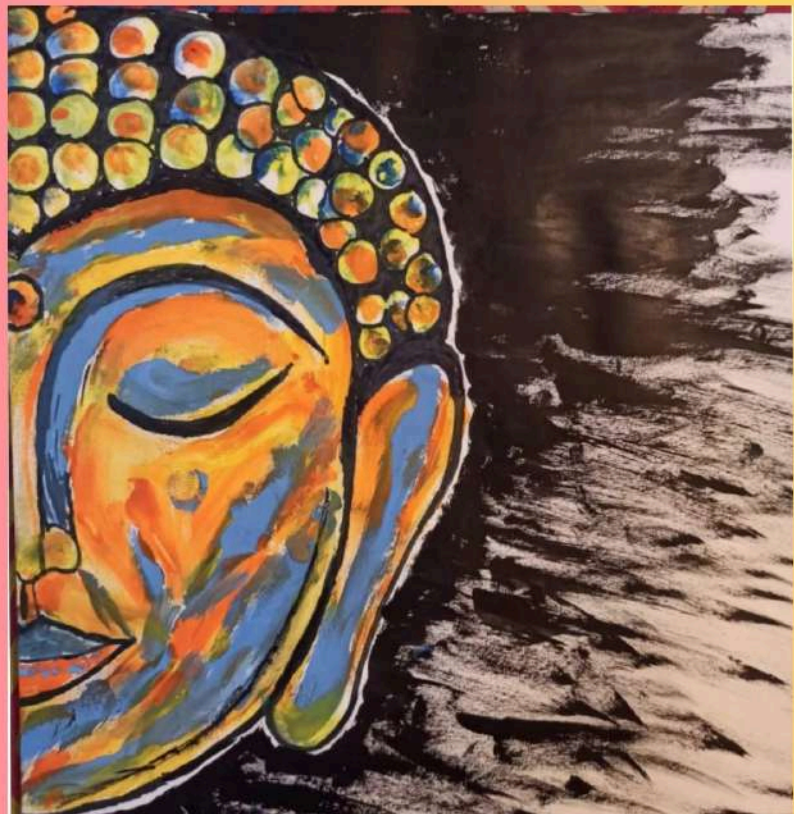

A Season of Change



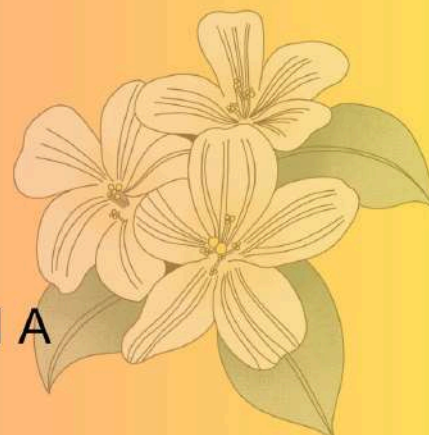

हम बस नंबरों की चिंता करें।

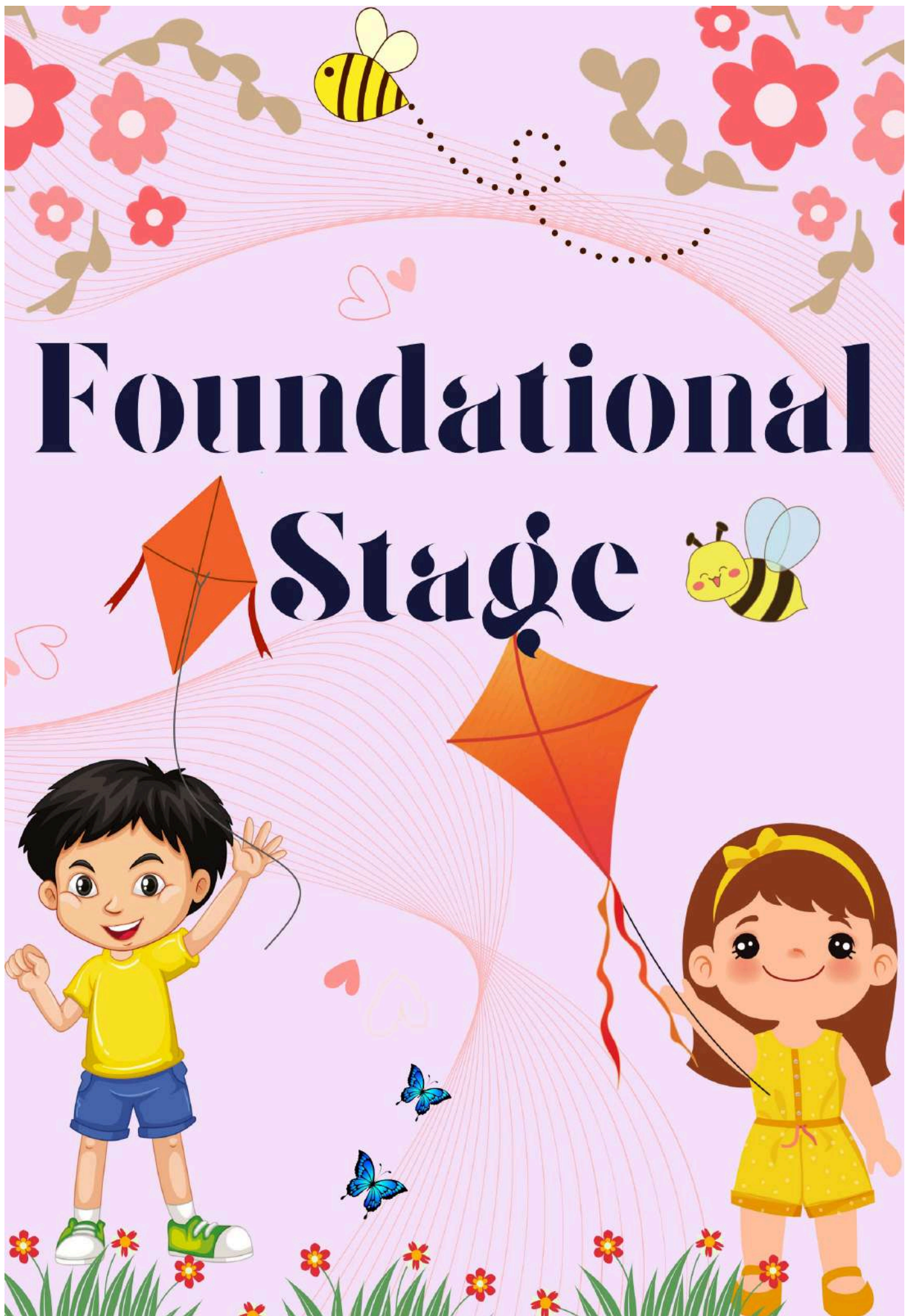

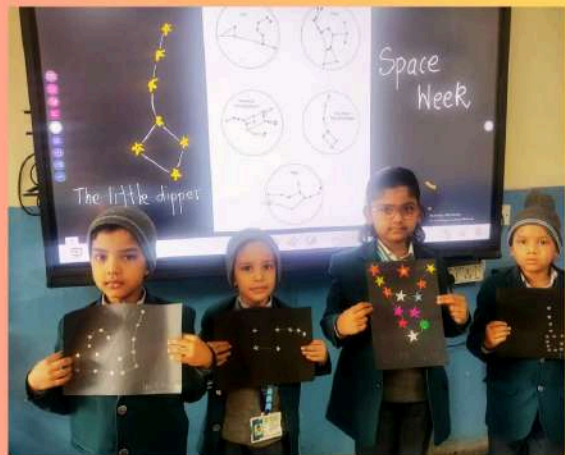
