ACTIVITY TIME

ROLL NO. 1 TO 40

CRAFT: DIY Starburst Light Decoration Using a Plastic Bottle

Materials Needed: 1 large plastic bottle (preferably clear or tinted), Scissors, Colorful star cutouts (in red, yellow, green, blue, orange, etc.) any shape can be used Glue or double-sided tape, Small LED tea light or fairy light, Fevicol.

Instructions:

- 1. Prepare the Plastic Bottle: Clean and dry the bottle. Cut off the bottom part and discard it. Use the top and middle portion for the decoration.
- 2. Make the Starburst Shape: From the cut edge, make long vertical slits up toward the neck of the bottle to form strips. Space them evenly around the bottle. Gently bend or curl these strips outward and backward to create a radial burst effect.
- 3. Add Star Decorations: Use pre-cut foam or paper stars in multiple colors(.Punch). Glue the stars randomly across the bent strips to create a vibrant, colorful pattern. You can double up on stars to cover both sides for a 3D effect Or any other shape can be used.
- 4. Add the Light Source: Place a battery-operated LED tea light or small fairy light in the neck/base of the bottle from the inside.(Optional). Secure it with glue if needed to keep it in place
- 5. Final Touches: Test the light and turn off the room lights to enjoy

ART: Your Favorite Cartoon Character

Materials Needed: Half cartridge sheet, Pencil and eraser, Black marker or sketch pen, Crayons, colored pencils, or sketch pens etc

Instructions for Students:

- 1. Choose Your Favorite Cartoon: Think about your favorite cartoon character (like Doraemon, Chhota Bheem, Shinchan, Tom & Jerry, etc.).
- 2. Plan Your Drawing: Visualize the pose you want to draw—standing, smiling, jumping, etc. You can use a picture for reference
- 3. Start with Pencil Sketching: Lightly draw the character using pencil. Begin with simple shapes (circles, ovals) to form the body, head, and limbs.
- 4. Add Details: Once you're happy with the basic shape, add facial features, clothes, and other details.
- 5. Outline the Drawing: Carefully trace your pencil sketch with a black marker or pen to make it neat.
- 6. Color Your Drawing: Use crayons, brush pen or colored pencils(any medium)to bring your cartoon to life. Try to match the colors of the real cartoon character.
- 7. Write the Name: Neatly write the name of the character below the drawing.
- 8. Clean Up: Erase any leftover pencil marks. Make sure your drawing sheet is neat and wrinkle-free
- 9. Paste the drawing after cutting n thermocol and cut extra thermocol sheet neatly.

Tips: Take your time and don't rush. You can add a simple background if you have extra time.

MUSIC: Write a short note on two famous singers of Sikkim and paste their pictures on half a cartridge sheet. Also decorate the border.

On an A3 size sheet draw / paste 5 photos each with names of western dance formal, Indian classical dance forms and Indian folk dance forms of India.



Design your own comic on an A3 size sheet. Some ideas are given below for reference:







1. Seed Dispersal Methods – Interactive Chart

Make a Foldable or pop-up chart on A3 size sheet, explaining how seeds are dispersed by different agents (wind, water, animals, explosion, etc.) – **SDG 15**

Make it attractive by drawing or pasting pictures and decorating it.

Note: You can add arrows or lines connecting methods to a central picture of a **plant** or **tree**.

- Write a small conclusion like:
 - "Seed dispersal helps plants grow in new places!"
- Use **bright colors** and keep labels neat and readable.

2. Road Signs: What They Mean

Road signs help keep everyone safe on the road. They give us important information. There are three main types:

1. Mandatory Signs (Red Circle)

These are rules we must follow.

Stop – You must stop your vehicle.

No Entry – You cannot go beyond this point.

Speed Limit – Do not go faster than the number shown.

2. Warning Signs (Triangle)

These signs warn us about danger ahead.

School Ahead – Drive slowly, children may be crossing.

Sharp Turn – Slow down, the road curves.

Pedestrian Crossing – Watch for people crossing the road.

3. Informative Signs (Rectangle or Square)

These give information.

Hospital – There is a hospital nearby.

Parking – You can park your vehicle here.

Petrol Pump – Fuel station ahead.

Choose any one road sign from all the three groups (total 3) and make cut outs of the same. (SDG 11)

3. Deficiency Diseases – Stay Healthy, Stay Strong

Collect all information related to any one nutrient including its source, diseases caused by its deficiency and various functions in the body. Display the information on a chart of A3 size. – **SDG 3**

Make it attractive by drawing or pasting pictures and decorating it.

Note: You can add definition of Deficiency Diseases.

- Write a small conclusion like: "Deficiency diseases can be prevented by eating a balanced diet, while Non-communicable diseases can be reduced by lifestyle changes like exercising and eating well." OR "Stay healthy by eating the right foods, exercising, and avoiding harmful habits. Good health is in your hands!" etc.
- Use bright colors and keep it neat and readable.




- 1) Paste a political map of the world and mark the grasslands of Russia, Australia, Africa, North America and South America on it.
